

Red Light, Purple Light



Cut different colored circles, squares, and triangles out of construction paper. Just like in the game *Red Light*, *Green Light*, an adult or child acts as a "stop light" by standing at the opposite end of the space from the other children. The "stop light" holds up different colors and shapes to represent stop and go. Each stop light decides which color/shape means "go" and which color/shape means "stop" when it is their turn. This game helps children practice paying attention, remembering rules and following directions in a fun and active way!

Freeze Game Fun!



Color-matching

The same construction paper cut-outs from *Red Light, Purple Light* can be used in this game! Tape different colored construction paper cut-outs on the floor. Have children dance when the music plays. When the music stops, hold up a specific color or shape that children have to stand on and freeze!

Statues

When it's time to freeze, strike a funny pose that children try to copy! Take turns being the leader.

Opposite dance

Switch between a variety of slow and fast songs. Challenge children to move SLOWLY to fast songs and QUICKLY to slow songs.

I can make a funny face Funny face, funny face. I can make a funny face. Watch and copy me!

Clap, Snap, & Stomp

In this game, one adult or child acts as the conductor. The conductor using clapping, snapping, and stomping to represent different movements! Assign a different action to each of the conductor's signals. For example, when the conductor claps, everyone hops on one foot. When the conductor snaps, everyone shakes their head. When the conductor stomps, everyone wiggles their noses. Take turns being the conductor.
