Research

Research has shown that children's behavioral regulation skills predict academic achievement. Children with high levels of behavioral regulation are better able to pay attention in class, listen to and follow directions, and interact positively with their peers. As a result, preschool children with high levels of growth in behavioral regulation have significantly higher levels of growth in vocabulary, literacy, and math than children with low levels of behavioral regulation.

Glue Markers Scissors Tape 2 Metal juice lids 2 Popsicle sticks Construction Paper



Directions:

Help children trace their hands onto tag board, cut them out, and decorate them! Glue one metal juice lid onto the inside of each hand. Tape a popsicle stick to the back of each hand. Put the hands together (metal juice lids touching and popsicle sticks on the backs) and tape the lower portion of the popsicle sticks together. When children hold and shake the popsicle sticks, the hands will clap!
